Delphi, midway in distance from each end, has the only publicly accessible, usable, recreational mile long watered section remaining of the W&E inside Indiana. Ohio does have several accessible watered sections.

Many people had been concerned with seeing a waterless canal in late winter. Then recently US Aggregates Stone Quarry was successful in replacing the damaged pipe section that burst on the coldest day in February.

Kind of like the homes that froze in Texas about that same time. Pipes in many of their residences burst when the electric grid failed and thus their freezing and bursting of water pipes was much like our situation.

All repaired now the beautiful flow of clean water returns to the old Wabash & Erie Canal section in Delphi thanks to those efforts of the stone company's crew. The flow from the quarry floor represents a two decade commitment to provide millions of gallons of water pumped from their mining operations. It is much appreciated as it is the lifeblood of the Canal Association's offerings to the public.

This brings us to continue our plans for opening our Canal Boat and Pioneer Village season an Memorial Day weekend. And to get Canal Park ready for the summer season we have a call out for a <u>Spring</u> <u>Cleanup Workday on Saturday May 8th</u> in the morning. A free lunch




