The Legacy of the Irish



The month of March is upon us, and on March 17th we will celebrate Saint Patrick's Day. It seems appropriate to remember and honor the integral part that Irish workers played in building the Wabash and Erie Canal.

Dora Mayhill writes in her history, "At times there would be as many as a thousand [Irish laborers] at work along one section of the canal. A number of writers have said that had it not been for the Irish, the National Road, the canals, and railroads in the United States would never have been built."

Amidst great hardship in Ireland during the 1800s there was a massive influx of Irish immigrants to America. These hardworking people came to seek a better life for their families, and they were often met with brutal working conditions. As pictured above, consider the physical toll of digging the 40-foot wide canal by shovel and wheelbarrow, mile after mile. Many
