A Quick History of "Canal Pork"



Last weekend, the Carroll County Chamber of Commerce hosted the very popular Indiana Bacon Festival, and it was a terrific time for all who attended. While Delphi is home to Indiana Packers, a prolific pork producer, you may not know that Delphi was also a key player in the industry during the Canal Era!

Long before Indiana Packers opened up shop, Spears, Case & Co. maintained one of the region's biggest pork packing operations. Their warehouse was located on a sidecut of the Wabash & Erie Canal, which made for convenient shipping.

What do you do at the Canal? I'm a docent at the Reed Case House, interpreting the person of Reed Case. He was a very versatile person during the Canal Era. I'm also on the Archives Committee. I divide my time between Canal Park and the Historical Society Museum.

Where are you from, and how long have you been volunteering at the Canal? I'm a Carroll County boy, although I live in Brookston. My heart is in Carroll County. I was born in Cutler, and my folks moved to the west of Flora, and later south of Delphi. I have ancestry in various townships.

I've lost track of how many years I've been involved, perhaps a little over 20 years. I helped research for the Interpretive Center and the Reed Case House. I was at the groundbreaking for the Interpretive Center. I've also done research on the McCain family, the Pigman family, and various Canal Era families.



A sidecut is like a small "driveway" off the main canal. Entrepreneurs could use private funding to build a sidecut for efficiency and direct canal access. The sidecut pictured above, used by Spears, Case & Co., is still easily seen from the VanScoy Towpath Trail near the foot of Main Street in Delphi.



One of the company's founders was Reed Case, the same man who oversaw canal construction in Miami County and from Delphi to Lafayette. He was a multi-faceted business tycoon!



How did you get involved at the Canal? I credit my late father for that. He had a keen interest in the canal and trails. He would come home talking about how wonderful the developing Delphi trails were, and all about canal boats. When he passed away in 2001, we planted a tree in his honor in the Pioneer Village. His name was Robert Smith.



What has been a highlight of volunteering at the Canal? think the time I orchestrated the proclamation from the Mayor's Office in Toledo. Ohio. I saw a need to celebrate the connection with the Port of Toledo. I corresponded with their office and received a proclamation that's in the Interpretive Center today. Another highlight was working with the Brackenridge family to track down portraits now housed in the Case House. Being acquainted with descendants of Reed Case is also a pleasure; it helps flesh

Hogs were brought to Delphi from across the Midwest, just like today. Newspaper accounts tell us what life was like back then:

December 1842: "From the fact that dealers here are giving better prices than Lafayette and Logansport, hundreds of hogs have been 'drove' to this place from Tippecanoe, Clinton, Cass, and White Counties. We candidly believe more business is transacted in Delphi than any town its size in the West. It is astonishing to see the number of people who visit our town daily. It seems to be much easier and more profitable to feed grain to the hogs and thus transport it to market, even for hundreds of miles, than to ship the corn as grain."

December 1843: "Slaughter houses in Delphi are very busy--the city is covered with wagon loads of hogs."

January 1844: "Pork still keeps up its prices in Delphi. Thousands of hogs have been slaughtered here this season, upward of 10,000. We venture to assert that better pork will not be shipped from any other point--Delphi is bound to be the big town on the Wabash just as sure as shootin'."

Business was so brisk that in 1849, Delphi passed an ordinance which forced the pork packing establishment to be moved further from town. You can imagine the nuisance caused by droves of hogs funneling through city streets!

Thanks to Mark Smith for passing along this research. You can visit him and learn more local history at the Reed Case House on Saturday afternoons through September 9.


