Historic Classes at Wabash and Erie Canal – Spring 2024

Coopering Tools

Learn a historic skill to make tools needed in coopering using historic tools and methods. This a 2-day class.

Friday and Saturday April 19, 20

9:00 – 5:00 with 1 hour lunch (bring your own lunch)

Instructor Peter Cooper. Peter has been coopering since 1997. He has taught coopering to over 500 students, and made coopered products for National historic sites, national parks and theme parks in the US and Canada.

Class Fee: \$165.00 + Material Fee: \$80.00 + Canal: \$33.00 = \$278.00

Skill Level: Beginner (students 14-18 are allowed if accompanied by an adult)

Class size: Minimum 2 students, maximum 5

Weaving

Learn weaving on a 4-harness and/or union loom and braiding scissor finders. Take home a few mug rugs, and one or two scissor finders. This is a one-day class.

Sunday May 5

9:00 – 4:00 with 1 hour lunch (bring your own lunch)

Instructor member of Weaving Guild. The Weaving Guild has existed for 40 years. Ryoko, the instructor, has been weaving 20 years. She retired from accounting; she "used to count money and now counts threads; it's much more fun."

Class Fee: \$42.00 + Material Fee: \$14.00 + Canal : \$8.00 = \$64.00

Skill Level: Beginner

Class size: Minimum 2, maximum 4

Location: Loom House

Participants bring pencil and notebook, scissors and a comb.



Coopering Bucket

Learn a historic skill to make a wooden bucket using historic tools and methods. Learn what old tools are still available today and make some that aren't. Students should feel comfortable using hand tools and will be learning to make staves, bottom hoops and rope handles. This a 2-day class.

9:00 – 5:00 with 1 hour lunch (bring your own lunch)

Broom Making

Learn to make a Hearth broom - You will learn the basics of hand tying a broom. We should make a broom with a handle during class.

Instructor Bev Larson. In 2009 Bev added broom making to her weaving experience and it too is now a passion. In 2016 she received the honor of being named an Indiana Artisan by the State of Indiana for both broom making and basket weaving.

Wool Felting

Make a needle felted cardinal (Indiana state bird) approximately 6" long. The cardinal can be used as an ornament or a free standing bird

Instructor Karen Bradshaw. About 20 years ago at a fiber fest Karen got instructions for wool felting and has enjoyed creating different items ever since. She has many items on her Christmas tree; and often needle felts on road trips.

Spinning

Students will learn to spin using both a drop spindle and foot-powered spinning wheel, and spin wool. A drop spindle and extra wool will be taken home for continued practice.

Basket Making

Learn to make a Hen Basket, melon shape going up into the handle.

Thursday May 23

9:00 – 3:00 with 1 hour lunch (bring your own lunch)

Instructor Bev Larson. Bev has been weaving since 1988 and teaching since 1999. She loves to share her joy of basket weaving. She has taught in many states and in the Caribbean on basket-making cruises. Her goal is to make basket weaving fun, relaxing and inspiring. In 2003 she won the Eiteljorg Museum Weavers Challenge.

Class Fee: \$72.00, includes materials

Skill Level: Beginner, age 16 – adult

Pine Needle Bowl

Students will make a bowl approx 9" dia x 2"h out of Long Leaf Pine Needles to take home. Great as a decoration or to hold a treasure. Wednesday, May 29, 2024

9:00 - 12:30 pm

Instructor Linda Cooper started making pine needle and straw bowls, baskets and more about 15 years ago. She has demonstrated crafts at the Indiana State Fair, Feast of the Hunter's Moon, Wabash and Erie Canal Paper Makers' Shop and at many festivals in the Midwest.

Class fee: \$42.00 + Material fee: \$15.00 + Canal: \$8.00 = \$65.00

Skill Level: Beginner

Class size: Minimum 2, Maximum 5

Location: Paper Maker's shop

Participants bring: small scissors, 1-2 old hand towels



Hand Quilting

Learn the basics of cutting fabric pieces, sewing those pieces back together to form a block, putting a border on the block, putting three layers of a quilt together, and quilting those three layers, then putting together a small pillow. OR make an 1850's sunbonnet with quilted brim.

Saturday June 1

9:00 – 5:00 with 1 hour lunch (bring your own lunch)

Becky Crabb was inspired to quilt as a child while watching her grandmothers quilt. After teaching herself the basics, she joined a group of older women quilters in Florida in the early 1970s. She taught basic hand quilting in adult education many years as well as occasional classes at libraries and quilt stores.

Class Fee: \$42.00 + Material fee: \$15.00 + Canal: \$8.00 = \$65.00 When register: indicate whether making a pillow or sunbonnet.

Skill Level: Beginning, age limit 14 unless special permission.

Class size: Minimum 3, maximum 10

Location: Fouts House, or if too many and if room available, in Interpretive

Center

Participants bring fabric scissors, heavy thimble that fits middle finger, pencil.
